We praise the Lord as we closed our fiscal year on June 30th with a balanced budget – our 28th over the past 29 years.

Thanks to your steadfast support, we have been able to meet the increasing needs of the community in both our residential and behavioral health services. Together with the Lord's grace, we are making a lasting, positive impact on the lives of many across our communities.

From our inception, our mission has been to provide children and families with "the opportunity to focus their lives and develop confidence, skills, intellectual abilities, spiritual insight, and moral integrity based on Godly principles, leading positive changes that benefit the child, the family, the community, and the nation."

Thank you for joining us in this honorable endeavor.

And today, we can look back at what the Lord has done in the lives of many:

- 9,112 boys and girls have been served on our Bristow Campus since 1986.
 - ➤ With 296 children served to date in 2025.
- 33,607 individual clients have been served at our Behavioral Health Regional Offices, requiring 266,046 sessions since the program's inception in 2012.

> To date, we have welcomed over 700 new clients, and our therapists have conducted over 20,000 sessions in 2025.

These results are more than numbers — they represent lives transformed, impacting not only the individual but their family and friends around them.

And, this is just the beginning as we enter a new chapter of service:

- We opened our <u>EIGHTH</u> Regional Office the first outside the Northern Virginia area – in Richmond!

Do you remember being asked what you wanted to be when you grew up in middle school? I remember looking at the paper and thinking about all the things I wanted to be—a nurse or even a scientist. I had so many choices when I was young.

However, I made some wrong choices. I chose to sneak out (sorry, Mom and Dad) instead of doing my homework. I chose to skip class and do things that led me to make poor decisions. Those choices left me with fewer options, and I will tell you, I did not like that.

I wish I could say that one day I woke up and decided to get better, but that would be a lie. Instead, I just got better at hiding the damage my poor choices caused. The choice I am making now is not to talk about my achievements or goals, but to thank the people who didn't judge me for my bad choices, and who led me to who I could become.

My parents chose to adopt a little girl who needed a good home; they sacrificed for years to help me succeed. My brothers chose to love me even when I wasn't easy to live with—and trust me, I wasn't. I will never know all the effort they put into my growth, but I do know that my mom is one of the strongest people I know and has done so much for me. Without her, I wouldn't be standing here in this cap and gown, so thank you, Mom, for helping me understand the power of choice.

- Thank you to the nurses who put my health first daily, and chose to get to know me, rather than judge me based on paperwork.

I thank God for each of you who has been part of my journey at Youth For Tomorrow.

I've acknowledged the adults in my life, and that I wouldn't be here without them. But I'd also like to recognize another group that has greatly influenced my mindset—thank you to the girls in the Chelsea House! Each of you holds a special place in my heart, and I will forever cherish the bond we share as a family.

I challenge all of you, not just my housemates, but all residents, to think about the choices you have made. If you could go back and change them, would you? I used to say I would, but today I stand here reflecting on everyone I've met, and I wouldn't change a thing. Despite all I've lost over the years, I have also gained so much.

I hope someday you look back on your life and the choices you've made and feel proud of who you've become. Because I chose not to dwell on my past mistakes, I can look forward to the new choices I will make and the person God intends for me to be.

I am ready to close this chapter of my life and embrace the next. I can pursue studying to become a therapist, venture into the science field, and discover new things. The options are limitless. 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
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Commanders Defensive Back, Mike Sainristil Visits YFT

Good evening!

My name is Anita Thomas, and it is an honor to stand before you tonight, not only as a former resident of Youth For Tomorrow, but as a transformed woman... a mother... a scholar... and a vessel of the very hope that once saved me.

I first spoke at this VERY event back in 2010, as a young girl weighed down by pain, trauma, and the grip of addiction. But tonight, it is different. Tonight, I speak not from the weight of my past, but from the strength of my present ... and the vision of my future. I've been an employee at Youth For Tomorrow for over five years now—the same place that once gave me a home and a new beginning.

I recently graduated from Old Dominion University with a Bachelor of Science in Psychology and a 3.5 GPA—an achievement that took me over a decade to complete while balancing school, motherhood, and fultime work. This fall, I begin my graduate program in Social Work at Virginia Commonwealth University.

At ODU, I earned recognition on the Dean's Perfect Scholar List for multiple semesters. I actively work in two research labs located at ODU and VCU. I've presented research at several academic conferences, including one for which I received the Undergraduate Diversifying Clinical Psychology Award.

But titles and accomplishments don't capture my whole story. I am more grounded today than I have ever been. I am rooted in my identity, balanced in my emotions, and STEADY in my purpose. I approach life's obstacles with wisdom earned from hard lessons and a heart that refuses to close.

There wasn't one single event that led me to YFT, it was the weight of everything I had been carrying inside. Years of trauma, dysfunction, and misguided attempts to cope...until the impact of it all began to show up in ways that couldn't be ignored. I was a child in crisis — emotionally, physically, and spiritually— and my life had begun to unravel.


By the time I was fourteen, the impacts of instability and early exposure to addiction had already taken root in my life. In my search for connection — especially with my father — I found myself drawn into unhealthy and self-destructive behavior patterns that only deepened my pain.

As things spiraled further, my mother was doing everything she could to raise three children alone, but the weight of our reality became too heavy. I was expelled from Prince William County Public Schools, facing criminal charges, and placed on probation. I had already fallen a year behind in school.

And then, our circumstances worsened — we lost our home, and we entered a homeless shelter... doing our best to make it through each day. My life was filled with fear and uncertainty at that moment.

But then, it also marked the start of something new. It led me to a place where healing could begin, and my life would truly start again.

Youth For Tomorrow didn't just house me — they held me. It poured into me academically, emotionally, and spiritually.

The teachers, residential staff, my therapist all helped shape the girl I was into the woman I have eventually become

I want to thank Mrs. Jean Jones for seeing my potential before I could see it myself.

And to Dr. Jones ... the man all of you know as the CEO, and the leader at YFT — but to many of us who entered YFT as lonely, depressed and, in many cases as traumatized children, we thank you for being a true father figure to us you reparented so many of us ... hundreds of us actually, with a father's love, discipline, and integrity.

One of the most healing moments of my life happened last May, when I walked across that stage and received my college degree. I looked out into the audience and saw my mother and my children smiling back at me. I saw in their faces a legacy.

As a first-generation graduate, I felt the fulfillment of my mother's deepest hopes ... and the beginning of something brighter for my children.

Motherhood has been a full-circle experience. Every day, I get to give my children the very things my mother worked so hard to provide: safety, care, and unconditional love.

My children are my joy ... my strength ... and living proof that generational healing is possible.

Today, I mentor youth at YFT. In their eyes, I see my past — and in my presence, I PRAY they see their future. I pull from my toolkit of lived experience, lessons, and testimony ... to help guide them through their own storms.

Faith has been my compass, not just something I believe, but something I walk in.

Even now, I face the common struggles of adulthood ... raising children ... balancing responsibilities ... managing stress ... and coping with the highs and lows that life brings. But even when my faith is weary, I LEAN into God. I move forward, one step at a time, knowing I am never walking alone.

I am pursuing my LCSW and, eventually, my Ph.D. because I believe in healing, not only for individuals but for entire communities and systems. I am called to do the work because children deserve more than just survival. They deserve protection, healing, and the freedom to dream, to thrive.

Through it all, I give thanks to Jesus Christ. My Savior, who stood beside me in my darkest moments, now walks with me in the light ... and every step I take is for the youth still searching for their way out of the darkness.

Thank you for believing in Youth For Tomorrow. Thank you for believing in our children. And thank you for allowing my story to remind you that what you pour into others ... multiplies.

Again, my sincerest gratitude to Coach Gibbs, Dr. Jones, and to each of you. I hope you have a wonderful evening."


