

Before Coming to Youth For Tomorrow:

"[Name Redacted], a 15-year-old female from Georgia, has a history of behavioral and emotional difficulties, including defiance, aggression, emotional dysregulation, and suicidal ideation. Over the past year, she has moved between living with her mother and father, with conflicts arising in both environments. Presenting concerns include running away from home, aggressive outbursts, and worsening mood. She has been hospitalized multiple times for suicidal ideation and attempts. Due to her severe impulsivity, depression, and safety concerns, intensive, structured residential treatment is recommended to stabilize her behavior and ensure her safety."


Leaving Youth For Tomorrow:

Thank you for your interest and support for the Youth For Tomorrow mission—to help at-risk youth, who are troubled or have been abused, as well as other individuals who seek mental health counseling.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, I thank and acknowledge our Founder and Chairman, Coach Joe Gibbs, for his faith in listening to the Lord and creating a home and school for youth in need of a Godly upbringing, caring support, and education.

YFT started as a campus for boys and later expanded to include homes for girls. We offer a Mommy and Me program, provide a safe haven for abused and neglected children, and oversee a foster care program. Our campus features 13 homes, the Joe Gibbs Academic and Physical Education School, the Peterson Family Chapel, administrative offices, and the Pruitt Administration and Behavioral Health Center. Here, leadership manages many programs, including the on-campus residences, the school, the chapel, and eight regional mental health offices.

The knowledgeable and experienced staff efficiently facilitates and carries out this important work. In April 1988, Coach Gibbs hired Dr. Gary Jones as a consultant on corporate issues and private philanthropic outreach. Dr. Jones was the former United States Under Secretary of Education and ex-Executive Director of the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation. In 1996, Dr. Jones was appointed Chief Executive Officer and has been instrumental in guiding the growth and expansion of YFT's programs and facilities over the past 29 years.

From my work with Youth for Tomorrow, starting as a volunteer in the 1990s and later as the director overseeing Dominion Energy's philanthropy in the Northern Virginia region, I have witnessed staff's extraordinary commitment at every level in the organization. Youth for Tomorrow professionals readily accept the requirements of safely and lovingly

sustaining this 24/7 operation with skill, teamwork, and compassion.

As Board president, I have had the opportunity to see, up close, the dedication of our board members in supporting the longevity of Youth for Tomorrow, contributing their knowledge, skills, and, yes, their giving.

Residential Programs



In our residential program, teens are placed in one of our 13 homes on campus. These children attend YFT's accredited secondary school and receive therapeutic counseling. Most residential placements are due to struggles with suicidal ideation, aggression, depression, substance abuse, and sexual exploitation and trafficking, which are among the many issues our professional staff from all departments face daily when working with our children.

We continue to navigate the increased level of acuity in youth, and at times, their mental health and substance abuse needs are as acute as those in some inpatient hospital settings.

A change in our license with DBHDS (Dept. of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services) increased the number of therapy sessions required per week. Each child now receives four clinical sessions weekly, including three individual and one family session. This will better support the needs of our youth but also presents a significant challenge as we must expand our clinical team.

Youth For Tomorrow Counseling

When admitted, all residents undergo comprehensive assessments and standardized screenings to evaluate their needs and develop their Individualized

Treatment Plan (ISP). Each child's legal guardian or placing agency participates in a monthly review of the treatment plan to assess the child's progress and set treatment goals.

Mommy and Me



There is a special home in The Wiser Village for Girls dedicated to pregnant teens and teen mothers to help them prepare for motherhood. The program offers them a chance to continue their education by attending our accredited, on-campus secondary

school, as well as providing childcare, counseling, and parenting skills training. The nursing staff monitors the health of the mother and their babies in partnership with community-based obstetricians, pediatricians, and other medical professionals.

Girls On A Journey



The Girls on a Journey program (GOAJ), launched in 2008, provides trauma-specific treatment to survivors of commercial sex trafficking and exploitation (CSEC). The program has helped hundreds of girls. Survivors of CSEC often face complex emotional, physical, and sexual trauma that needs targeted treatment. They also experience emotional, behavioral, and mental health symptoms that are frequently overlooked or misdiagnosed. Without proper support and treatment, the risk of re-victimization remains high.

Unaccompanied Immigrant Minors

Responding to a Presidential request in 2012, Youth For Tomorrow provides shelter, counseling, medical care, and reunification services for unaccompanied children entering the U.S.


The Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) sends its newly hired staff, including upper management, to YFT as an introduction to a program that operates like a “well-oiled machine.”

With a change in administration, many policies have been updated, leading to more extended stays for most children and allowing for more thorough vetting of prospective sponsors.

The extended stays have required all components, including Case Management, Clinical, Medical, Residential, Education, and Quality Assurance, to familiarize themselves with these new policies and processes.

The UIM teams handled several more complex cases successfully when other similar facilities could not. This includes medically complex cases with heightened behaviors and cases involving legal issues. Additionally, children who had been in previous placements and transferred to YFT for more structured support were able to show improvements, receive diagnoses, and have individualized service plans implemented, which they carried with them upon discharge.

YFT has continued to receive children, although other facilities have been empty, due to its excellent reputation and consistently high-quality of services offered.



Counseling Programs

All residential students at Youth For Tomorrow receive regular counseling services. Upon arrival, each resident participates in the development of an individual treatment plan that targets issues specific to the resident and the family unit. They receive regular onsite individual and group counseling as well as community mental health services for those with special needs. Family sessions are provided as requested and involve the resident, parents or guardians and the therapist. The goal is to prepare each for reunification with his or her family or to explore alternatives for their future and livelihood.

YFT's Student Life and Aftercare



Many residents who graduate from Youth For Tomorrow do not have family or a support system to help guide them as they transition to a new, independent phase of their lives. Aftercare counseling provides teens and young adults with the support and guidance they need to pursue career paths, reinforce life skills and maintain emotional stability.

Our Aftercare Coordinator and a cadre of mentors help our young adults with their personal development, teaching responsibility and accountability, and assisting with developing their resumes so they can successfully transition to a career through postsecondary education or training.

The Dr. Gary L. Jones Scholarship Fund offers YFT graduates the opportunity to pursue their academic goals and career ambitions. The scholarships enable our disadvantaged students to attend college or access vocational training to join the workforce and earn a living wage.

Our ultimate goal is to help our graduates earn a living wage and attain financial independence.

Military Service Families



Children of military service members have unique challenges, such as lengthy separations from a parent or multiple moves as their parent is redeployed. Youth For Tomorrow provides specialized assistance and support to address their needs, including trauma-informed care with individual therapy.

Veterans employed at YFT meet with the children to discuss their specific issues. The boys and girls also attend the YFT school and receive tutoring and supportive interventions where needed.



Education Programs



YFT's accredited secondary school on campus is highly respected by social service agencies for the "wraparound" services we offer, which integrate our residential, educational, and counseling programs through a single provider – Youth For Tomorrow.

Often, teens come to YFT after years of truancy and are one to as many as three years behind grade level. YFT's low student-to-teacher ratio allows students to receive one-on-one instruction as needed to strengthen their academic abilities.

YFT administers quarterly assessments in reading and math. We find that the majority of our students increase their reading and math levels by at least one grade level.

During the summer school session, an incentive program was implemented, and we saw great results. Students were encouraged to improve their performance both academically and behaviorally to earn "weekly reward points." We saw notable improvements in student behavior, efforts, and overall confidence.

When asked about desired additions to the education program, the principal said, *"I would love to see more vocational and life skills activities during the school day. Recently, we discovered a resident didn't know how to use a vacuum cleaner. Our summer school included STEM activities that totally engaged the students with curiosity and awe."*



Spiritual Ministry Program



Serving "The Least of These"

"Whatsoever you do for the least of Mine, you do for Me." Matthew 25:40

This verse has been the heartbeat of Youth For Tomorrow since Coach Joe Gibbs founded Youth For Tomorrow in 1986. Now, 40 years later, it remains the lens through which we view every hurting child who arrives at our doorstep. This year, the same faithful presence that has defined this ministry since the arrival of the first four boys on our campus

Led by our Campus Pastor, Telos Fuller, our residential homes, school, and Chapel continued to be places where the Gospel is not just taught but lived out. Whether it was during a walk around the campus, sitting on a bench in the Circle of Hope in front of the school, or at the pulpit of the Chapel, Pastor Fuller's ministry oversaw and counseled 250 salvations in 2025!

This year was marked by the same faithful presence that has defined this ministry since the very first four boys arrived on our campus. Led by our Campus Pastor, Telos Fuller, our residential homes, school, and Chapel continued to be places where the Gospel is not just taught but lived. Whether it was on a walk around the campus, seated on a bench in the pavilion,



or in the pulpit of the Chapel - Pastor Fuller's ministry oversaw and counseled 250 salvations in 2025!

Pastor Fuller's leadership was supported by spiritual leaders who served faithfully alongside him.


- Volunteer Pastor Israel Salguero, who pastored, taught, prayed over, and performed baptisms for our Hispanic residents.

Every hug, every consequence, every Bible study, and bedtime prayer was an act of devotion—because when we serve these lost children, we serve Him.

To God be the glory—great things He has done, is doing, and will continue to do at Youth For Tomorrow.



A Note from a Former Resident's Mom

Dr. Tinsley,

I'm writing to you with an update on my son, "A."

First, what on earth did you do with our child?!?!? He's a completely different kid—way different from how he presented in sessions. He's thoughtful, respectful, kind, takes initiative, and is enjoyable to be around.

On Friday, he was home alone for a bit while his father and I were at work. I came home and he had done the following, without prompting from anyone:

- *Cleaned the kitchen*
- *Emptied the trash*
- *Polished the dining room table*
- *Organized the boys' toys in the living room*
- *Took the trash out*

And, he greeted me at the front door when I got in and helped with the 3 dogs who can be quite a handful when walking through the door.

As a Christian faith-based, non-denominational organization, our mission is to provide timely, accessible care to all children and families in need, including those in foster care, without turning anyone away. At YFT-BHS, we are not just a catalyst for positive change—we are saving lives, helping young people navigate crises and move toward healthier, more resilient futures.

Imagine a young adolescent struggling with depression, anxiety, or thoughts of self-harm, who has no insurance, limited family resources, and nowhere to turn for help. Without timely, trauma-informed counseling, this child's struggle could escalate—impacting their safety, academic performance, and emotional development. At YFT-BHS, we see this every week and are addressing those needs in our community.

Through outpatient counseling, we provide a safe, trauma-informed environment where youth can process experiences, develop coping strategies, and rebuild confidence. Our approach emphasizes family support and counseling, addressing family systems to strengthen relationships and home environments.

Over time, youth demonstrate improved emotional well-being, reduced self-harm behaviors, and greater engagement in school and community life.

This vital work would not be possible without the support of our donors, board members, and community partners. Your generosity enables us to extend hope, healing, and professional life-saving care to children and families every day.

Opening the Richmond Regional Office

This year marked an exciting milestone with the opening of our 8th regional office at the Premier Tech Center in Richmond (2810 N. Parham Road).

A ceremonial ribbon-cutting ceremony was held on June 10th with Governor Glenn Youngkin and Secretary of Health and Human Resources Janet Kelly.

Since opening, the office has received daily calls for counseling, reflecting strong community need and growing awareness. We are encouraged by this promising start and confident that momentum will continue into the coming year.

Licensure and Credentials Achieved

Over the past year, several therapists in our program successfully advanced their professional credentials, reflecting both their dedication and the strength of our training and supervision. Achievements include:

- Two Licensed Professional Counselors (LPC)
- One Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW)
- One Licensed Substance Abuse Treatment Practitioner (LSATP)
- One Certified Substance Abuse Counselor (CSAC)
- One Registered Play Therapist Supervisor (RPT-S)

These accomplishments demonstrate the ongoing growth and professional development of our team, ensuring high-quality care for the individuals and families we serve.

Mental Health Challenges, Needs, and Concerns for School-Aged Children

At YFT-BHS, we have observed an increased need for outpatient counseling among school-aged children and families. Key data points in Northern Virginia:

- **High Rates of Mental Health Disorders:** 1 in 7 children aged 6–17 annually (nami-northernvirginia.org)

- **Financial Barriers:** High out-of-pocket costs; inadequate insurance coverage

Community Services



Therapeutic Day Treatment

In FY25, with new leadership, the Therapeutic Day Treatment (TDT) program started working with nearby counties to rebuild or establish new partnerships within their public schools. Goals and outcomes were set to ensure effective TDT service delivery for their students.

Additionally, new behavioral specialists were hired and completed specific TDT training to ensure they understood expectations and how to communicate with each other and supervisors to continue receiving support.

New staff and changes within the Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) and the Medicaid program and providers have delayed authorizations for YFT to begin providing services. Parents, school guidance counselors, and social services are navigating these challenges to secure the necessary approvals for TDT services for their children.

Several parents have reported significant improvements in their children's behavior and have expressed gratitude for the opportunity to communicate with our TDT specialists, knowing that their children's best interests are always a top priority. Additionally, many teachers have noted major

positive changes in the behaviors and attitudes of the children who received services.

Notes of gratitude from parents:

I feel the service has helped because he is getting an understanding of his behavior and how society works in the school environment and has a good male role model in the specialist."

"Overall, the TDT service is great, and the extra support he receives has helped tremendously. He now enjoys going to school, and I don't think he would have made it this far without his behavioral specialist."



Community Services

Foster Care Program

Children in our Therapeutic Foster Care (TFC) program show significant personal and academic improvement this year. Several teens reached important milestones, including graduating from high school, gaining employment, enrolling in college, and reuniting with family members.

Many children who enter foster care have struggles with both behavioral and emotional challenges, and they are now thriving thanks to consistent structure, therapy, and supportive foster family relationships.

The program continues to focus on each child's individualized treatment plan that promotes self-esteem, emotional regulation, and positive decision-making and development.

A notable success within our TFC Program is a teenage boy who has been in our care since 2022. When he entered the program, he struggled with significant behavioral challenges, academic failure, truancy, and resistance to engaging in therapy or open communication. Through consistent support from his foster family, dedicated case management, and treatment, he has achieved remarkable personal growth.

Today, this young man is in his second year of college and is on track to earn his Associate's Degree in

Spring 2026. He is working part-time, has purchased his own vehicle and insurance, and is planning to transfer from Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA) to George Mason University (GMU) to pursue a degree in Information Technology. He has continued his treatment and attends outpatient therapy through Youth For Tomorrow. He enjoys going to the gym and wrestling with friends as healthy outlets for stress management.

Additionally, other children in the program have achieved permanency through reunification with their biological families and/or relatives. These results show YFT's dedication to personalized support, trauma-informed care, and stable, nurturing placements that foster long-term well-being and independence.

Several foster parents have expressed their deep appreciation for our Foster Care Team and their unwavering support for their families.

One foster parent shared, "Working with YFT's Family Specialist and team is great!" Another foster family mentioned that they now have a better understanding of the foster care system, including both Treatment and Transitional Foster Care (TFC), and that they now appreciate the unique contributions of everyone involved.

Jason Miyares, VA Attorney General Remarks at the Heart 2 Heart Gala



"This is going to be very brief, I promise you, but Youth For Tomorrow is very personal for me. I visited their campus last year. First, to everyone who works there, we have such a misnomer in our society about who our heroes are. We think that if you can read off a teleprompter, memorize a speech, or have a name on the back of a jersey, you're a hero, but the real heroes are the quiet heroes. They get up every day, they never seek recognition, they never have their name mentioned, but they ultimately, fundamentally transform people's lives.

That is what the individuals who work and volunteer with Youth For Tomorrow do every day.

One of the articles of my faith is a Latin term. I'm not smart enough to speak Latin, but I know what it means, Imago Dei, which means image of God. It means that every person I meet on this earth, regardless of who they are or where they find themselves in their station of life, has an amazing and intrinsic value because they're made in the image of their Creator.

Dr. Gary Jones, the leader at Youth For Tomorrow, follows that every day. I received a call last year from

a family friend, and it was a call that I know they never wanted to make. They were at the end of their ropes. I won't say their name, but their grandson's name was Chase. Chase had a lot of demons in his life. Chase had a lot of addiction issues and had seen a lot of abusive things. When they called me, they were at the end of their ropes. For some reason, they thought I could help their grandson. The first thing I told them was there's only one place I know that can help save and heal Chase, and that's Youth For Tomorrow.

It was probably around 10:30 or 11:00 p.m., and I picked up the phone to call Gary, and he answered. Not knowing what he would say, and that he knew almost nothing about the situation, within 24 hours, YFT had a bed for Chase.

His life was changed eternally when he met the Lord at Youth For Tomorrow, where he finally, after so many years, was able to conquer his demons. The great work that Dr. Terry Tinsley, Dr. Jones, and so many of the staff at YFT do for young people who have survived human and sex trafficking, unimaginable abuse, and young kids who have literally seen the face of hell. By their compassion and love, they show them a glimpse of Heaven.

It is mentioned about gratitude. I tell my daughters frequently that gratitude is the most underrated of all human traits. I think all of us here tonight have gratitude for the leadership of Dr. Gary Jones, Coach Gibbs, and all of those at Youth For Tomorrow. On behalf of the Commonwealth of Virginia, thank you for your leadership in caring for the least among us. God bless you."



Commanders Defensive Back, Mike Sainristil Visits YFT







In the Old Testament there is the Book of Nehemiah. Nehemiah was a Cupbearer to the King of Persia and asked the king if he might go to the city of Jerusalem, the birthplace of his forefathers to rebuild the wall and gates surrounding the city. 


